Some Highlights of 2023

2023 brought many new opportunities. Here are some of our memorable moments!

- Shiprock Marathon was rated "One of the 10 best marathons in USA" by USA Today. Shiprock was again a Boston Qualifier and a part of the Abbott Marathon Majors Masters World Championships.
- The first Rails to Trails event had a great turnout and showed the communities what R2T on the Navajo Nation could be.
- We brought six new Code Talker portraits to life and shared thousands of Code Talker posters.
- The Tour de Rez Series achieved its 6th season.



2023 Year in Review

Here at NavajoYES, we oversee several programs; some of which include, the Navajo Parks Race Series, the Tour de Rez Cup Series, and the Dine' Bike Project. Here is a look back on some of the highlights of these project.

Navajo Parks Race Series

This year the Navajo Parks Race Series held ten running events throughout 2023, with over 3085 runners taking part.

Tour de Rez Cup Series

The Tour de Rez Cup Series held six bike racing events throughout 2023, with a combined 386 bikers!

Dine' Bike Project

The Dine' Bike Project continues to receive, repair, and share donated used bikes with schools, families, and communities across the Navajo Nation. This year the Dine' Bike Project shared 716 bikes with families and schools from 37 different communities in exchange for a good deed in the recipient's home community.

Trail Projects



Rail To Trail

One of our most adventurous trail projects in our history is the Rail-to-Trail Navajo Initiative. We have been advocating for a Rail-Trail on the former Black Mesa & Lake Powell Railroad route since 2019, when the last coal train rumbled down the tracks. Since that time, we have engaged in over 50 meetings in the local communities of Tonalea, Shonto, Lechee, Kaibeto, Page and Tsahbiikin; promoting the development of a rail-trail route. Our advocacy has been enhanced in 2023 with the creation of the Navajo Railroad Board, with whom we meet and collaborate with on a regular basis. We hope to get the green light from the chapters and the Nation to proceed in the new year and have developed a solid plan for what a Navajo rail-trail would look like.

Our Trail Partners

Since our inception in the 1990's, NavajoYES has been involved in trail work around the Nation. The impact of our trail work was amplified with the involvement of our trail partners: American Conservation Experience (ACE), Ancestral Lands Program (ALCC), and Wings of America. ACE crews were engaged in major restoration efforts on the Rainbow Bridge Trails, one of our most remote trail systems across the Nation. ALCC partnered with us in our efforts of creating and restoring trails in Monument Valley Navajo Tribal Park. We worked with two Wings of America camps this summer and shared the joy of trail building with these young runners. Through our partnerships, we were able to maintain trails in Monument Valley Navajo Tribal Park, Rainbow Bridge Trail, and Little Colorado River Navajo Tribal Park. We have added shade ramadas and other amenities on trails across the rez.
